

What can I study?

There are two pathways through the Sixth Form and the one that you choose will largely be dictated by the grades that you achieve at the end of Year 11.

The difference between them is that Academic A-levels are almost exclusively assessed through long examinations at the end of Year 13 whilst the Applied General Level 3 qualifications focus on continuous assessment with a smaller examination component. Therefore, for many students, the Applied General Level 3 qualifications would be more appropriate and may form either a full programme or be mixed with Academic Level 3 qualifications.

There are few careers (Medicine, Engineering, Veterinary science and Dentistry being the main ones) where your choice of Level 3 course is crucial; for most degrees, it is evidence of success at Level 3 study that is more important and you should choose subjects that you are good at and enjoy, as you are most likely to be successful with them.

LEVEL 3 PATHWAY

This pathway is for those students who achieve a minimum of five subjects at grades 5 and above, including in English and Maths, at GCSE or the equivalent in BTEC (combination of grades 4 and 5 will be considered on an individual basis). Each subject listed will also have an entry requirement that you will need to meet in order to study it. We put these entry requirements in place because we know that without them, you will struggle to be successful in Level 3 courses. Most students study a Level 3 programme.

All kinds of Level 3 courses (Academic and Applied General) are equally acceptable to universities, employers, and the university admissions service (UCAS). UCAS studies show that a quarter of undergraduate students now enter university having studied at least one Applied General qualification as part of their school education. Once at university, 90 per cent of former Applied General learners go on to receive a first or second class degree.

LEVEL 2 PATHWAY

This pathway is for those students who either do not want to study Level 3 courses, or who do not meet the entry requirement to do so, or who would prefer to stay at school for an additional year before looking for vocational training, apprenticeships or employment elsewhere.

Our 'Ready to Work' course has been designed to gain you additional qualifications and skills that will help you to move either on to a Level 3 course with us or training and employment. It is divided into core units and a Level 2 vocational qualification in Travel and Tourism.

These sessions are based on the VESPA model which helps all students to develop their Vision, Effort, Systems, Practice and Attitude. The ethos behind this is to help develop a Sixth Form 'mindset' as well as focusing on employability skills. A key feature of this is providing students with a wealth of study skills support from the Sixth Form team, including advice on memory improvement techniques and how to cope with the potential anxieties caused by examinations.

Students are also encouraged to think about the transferable skills they have and how their time in Sixth Form will help prepare them for the future. In Year 12 we are unusual in that we offer a week of work experience to all students, where they will be supported to find placements to help them with their future career paths. Last year, a group of students came third nationally in Micro-Tyco, a finance and fundraising competition which saw nine of our students gain invaluable work experience with Deloitte.

Ofsted highlighted that for our students "Staying on into the sixth form gives them time to mature in a familiar and supportive environment. They make the most of this time and leave well prepared for their future lives."

Many EPCS6 students act as mentors for students in the lower school and they have proven to be excellent role models and sources of support. Ofsted commented that, "their behaviour is exemplary and they contribute much to school life."

Every Wednesday afternoon is timetabled for enrichment where you can undertake a variety of volunteering activities including an opportunity to arrange charity events. The Sixth Form currently support the Hotcourses Foundation, a charity which works to raise money for Nyumbani projects in Kenya.





You also have the opportunity to participate in a variety of sporting activities. Inside the classroom, students may undertake the Extended Project Qualification. Offered in the summer term of Year 12, this is a chance to gain an additional AS qualification in a research area of your choosing. Universities and employers rate this highly as it shows independence and for some students helps them secure a place at their preferred university.



Last year, 100% of our students who applied through UCAS secured a place at university.
