Our PSHE curriculum aims to teach all students the importance of being kind to one another. They should understand their behaviour and language can impact others. They will be able to listen to, and respect others' opinions even if they do not necessarily agree with them. Students will be able to discuss their views regarding a range of social issues including relationships, substance abuse, financial stability, and mental health and know where to seek support if required. They will know where to seek career advice.

Year 9	By the end of the year Year 9 students will have recognised that harm come in many forms and discovered that they can sometimes, unwittingly be the cause of harm. They will identify ways to prevent and reduce harm to themselves, others and the world around them. In addition to this, Year 9 will consider their internet safety and further issues such as sexting. They will discuss mental health and other issues raised by 'Hidden' performed by Peer Productions. 'One Killer Punch' will be examined and the impact that one split-second decision can have on someone's life. Students will also develop their knowledge of first aid.

Year 10	By the end of the year Year 10 students will have discussed different kinds of relationships, the concept of marriage within today's society. They will decide what constitutes a happy relationship as well as what an abusive relationship might look like and participate in conversations regarding attitude towards sex, contraception and relationships. Students will also participate in mock interviews having prepared CVs and letters of application. Students will look at helping those less fortunate and attempt to raise money for charity. They will also look at money management.
