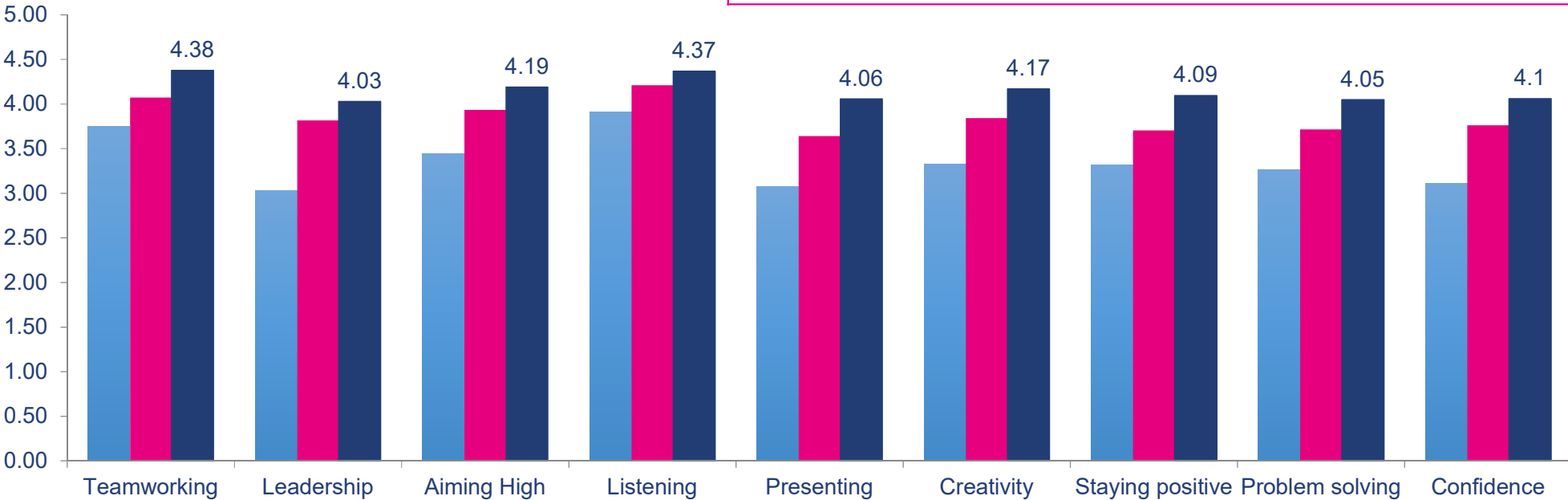

STUDENT SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Results based on evaluation surveys from students. Highlighting skills most developed following both the **CV workshop and the mock interview.**

Key skill development
Teamworking – I respect and work well with others
Listening – I am able to listen and understand what is being told to me.
Aiming High – I have high aspirations and know what I would like to achieve within my life
Creativity – I am able to generate and develop new ideas.
Confidence – I trust my abilities, qualities and judgement

WHAT IS THE MOST IMPORTANT THING YOU'VE LEARNT FROM THE CV WORKSHOP?

*“There are better ways to **explain yourself** than just by saying 'I'm a good leader'.”*

*“You can always find more than one good skill to put on your CV and to **be confident** in what you say”*

*“A CV is more important than I thought. We need to give **time and dedication**. ”*


*“I have more **skills** than I thought I did”*

*“Your CV needs to be **100% honest**”*

*“Elaborate on the skills that I have by **giving examples**.”*

*“The CV needs to be **professional** because it tells the employer what kind of person you are. ”*

*“I should always ask another person to **check my CV**”*

*“The most memorable part of the programme would be the **interview feedback** purely because I found it very helpful for me to work on for the future.”*

*“I enjoyed **talking to the lady** because she was very nice and easy to talk to.”*

*“always ask questions and take the **feedback on board** and listen to their ideas”*

*“Walking in I was terrified, but my interviewer was really **friendly** so everything was fine.”*

*“I learnt about what a interview is actually like, I realised that it **isn't as bad as people describe it** as.”*

STUDENTS
